The POINT>

Our hope in Christ changes how we view the world and live in it.

>1 PETER 1:13-25

¹³Therefore, with your minds ready for action, be soberminded and set your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ¹⁴ As obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires of your former ignorance. 15 But as the one who called you is holy, you also are to be holy in all your conduct; 16 for it is written, Be holy, because I am holy. ¹⁷ If you appeal to the Father who judges impartially according to each one's work, you are to conduct yourselves in reverence during your time living as strangers. 18 For you know that you were redeemed from your empty way of life inherited from your fathers, not with perishable things like silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of an unblemished and spotless lamb. ²⁰ He was foreknown before the foundation of the world

but was revealed in these last times for you. 21 Through him you believe in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. 22 Since you have purified yourselves by your obedience to the truth, so that you show sincere brotherly love for each other, from a pure heart love one another constantly, ²³ because you have been born again—not of perishable seed but of imperishable through the living and enduring word of God. 24 For All flesh is like grass, and all its glory like a flower of the grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, ²⁵ but the word of the Lord endures forever. And this word is the gospel that was proclaimed to you.

LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS

Day One JOHN 13:34a

Jesus had been with His disciples for three years, and this was the night He'd been moving toward the whole time. Jesus had just enjoyed the last supper with those closest to Him, and in a few short hours, He'd be arrested, put on trial, and hung on the cross. In this in-between time, He announced that He'd be leaving and spoke a few final important thoughts to the disciples about the ways they should live after He'd gone. For generations, the Jews had followed the law as their way to live in God's favor, but Jesus had demonstrated through His life that simply obeying the law wasn't enough. On this final night before He'd give His life on the cross, Jesus communicated to His followers that they needed to understand this principle. It wasn't enough to follow the law—they needed to understand there was a new and different standard.

When have you been tempted to believe that by being "good," you earned God's favor?

Day Two **JOHN 13:34b**



Galatians 5:14 teaches that "the whole law is fulfilled in one statement: Love your neighbor as yourself." The whole law, all 613 commands. There are 248 positive commands—things like pray to God and read the Shema morning and evening. There are 365 negative commands, such as don't lie and don't carve an image that represents God. For a person to live in God's favor, he'd have to keep every command perfectly. This is absolutely impossible, yet Jesus taught that the spirit of the law all along was to teach us to love God and others. The new command Jesus gave His followers was this—we are to choose moment by moment to show love to one another with all we do and say. This fulfills all the law.

How do you see that loving others fulfills all the Old Testament commands?

Day Three JOHN 13:34c

It's one thing to love others, but it's a different thing altogether to love as Jesus did. Let's ask ourselves, how did Jesus love? First, He was willing to leave heaven and come to earth, which was a pretty big inconvenience, to say the least. He was willing to go through this life with no place to lay His head. He set aside the things He may have wanted personally in order to continually serve others. And ultimately, Jesus was willing to face rejection, persecution, suffering, and death. He did all of these things because of the love He had for people who had rebelled against God. To love others this way seems impossible. In fact, it is impossible. Yet this is exactly what God has called us to. Thankfully, though we could never accomplish it ourselves, through the Spirit's working to transform our hearts, God can use us as an expression of His love for the people around us.

How would you describe the love of Jesus?

Why is it difficult to love like this? Pray that God would help you love others like Jesus.

Day Four JOHN 13:35a

Churches are made up of imperfect people, and we often bring our weaknesses into the ways we relate to one another. Many people in churches all across America have experienced frustrations, conflict, others being unkind, and many other expressions of our desperate imperfections. The truth is that there should be no place for these things in the church, but because we're imperfect people, we'll always face these issues. The mark of true disciples isn't perfection: it's dealing with our own sins and imperfections in a loving way. Too many times, when people are hurt by others, they check out and walk away. This isn't love. The world sees the difference Christ makes in our lives when we love one another, especially when it's not easy.

When have you been upset by something that happened in the church?

How can you deal with these things in a loving and gracious manner?

Day Five JOHN 13:35b



"If" is a big word. It means we have a choice. It means that, although Jesus has commanded something, whether or not it actually happens depends on us. God's desire for His people has been the same since the beginning of creation. We've been called to love one another as a reflection of God's character. To teach us how to live this way, God gave us the law and spoke through the prophets, and ultimately, He sent Jesus. It's now our responsibility to live out the things to which He's called us as an expression of our love for God and others. Every day, how will you choose to answer the "if"? Let's choose love!
