LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // BIBLE

The Bible consists of the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments and is the only inspired written Word of God.

Among the greatest privileges associated with faith in Christ is our relationship with God, and relationships are built on communication. Therefore, prayer is essential for every Christian. Yet, many believers don't pray as we should. One of the most effective tools for growing in prayer is praying Scripture. It helps us to focus our prayers. It gives us confidence when we pray, because we know our prayers are established on truth and not just our opinions. Plus, we see believers in both the Old and New Testaments, as well as Jesus, praying Scripture (Neh. 9:5-37; Acts 4:24-26; Mark 15:34).

Day One JAMES 5:13

Suffering and cheerfulness represent the ends of the spectrum of the human experience. There will certainly be times when things go right, when we're happy and totally aware of the many things we have to be thankful for. On the other hand, there will be times when it seems like everything is going wrong, and we're overwhelmed by life's difficulties. What Pastor James says is pray! In all of life's circumstances, we should live with an attitude of prayer and praise to God. The natural response to suffering should be to express our dependence upon God to help us through. The natural response to things going well should be to joyfully express our gratitude and praise to God, who provides all good things in our lives. Whatever the circumstances, we are to pray.

Why is it important to live continually in prayer?

What do you have to thank God for? Express your gratitude.

Day Two **JAMES 5:14**



When we go through difficult times, we are ourselves to go to God in prayer. But this isn't all. We're to invite others, specifically the pastors in our church, to pray for us. James wrote to Christians who dealt with a specific kind of "sick." Because of their faith in Christ, these believers were suffering intense persecution. Sickness likely refers to being weak and ill from the abuse they suffered. James instructed them to have church leaders anoint the sick with oil and pray that God would provide comfort and healing. God uses the prayers of others to make a powerful difference in our lives.

What are you weak from right now?

Who will you invite to pray for you this week?

Day Three JAMES 5:15a

We understand that the sick person here was so weak that he was, perhaps literally, unable to stand up. This is why he needed the Lord to raise him up. We don't know specifically what led to this circumstance, but we know this sick person was in a desperate situation. At times, we try to solve our own problems until we come to the point of absolute desperation, and then we beg God to rescue us and turn to others for help. But the truth is that our first response should be pursuing prayer and the support of others. No matter where we find ourselves, even if we've neglected prayer in the past. God calls us to turn to Him. When we pray in faith and are surrounded by others doing the same, God works powerfully through those prayers and brings healing, particularly spiritual healing, into our lives.

Day Four JAMES 5:15b-16a

It's not enough to ask God for healing. We have to confess our sins, turn away from pursuing the wrong things, and devote our lives to Jesus. Many people want the blessings of God but aren't willing to give up the worldly things they want. God's physical healing in our lives points to the spiritual healing He wants to bring to our hearts. Therefore, we can never expect healing without repentance. One of the best ways we can make sure to be consistent in putting away sin from our lives is to confess to a trusted friend or leader. If we sin in secret, then repent in secret, it's far too easy to fall back into old habits. But if we invite others to walk with us through our struggles, their prayer and support can make a big difference.

Day Five JAMES 5:16b



Many people today believe they have God's favor based on the fact that they're a "good person." Good, in this sense, is essentially the same as righteous—doing what's right in God's sight. This "good person" perspective couldn't be more wrong, because there has only ever been one truly good person, and that's Jesus. When James refers to a righteous person, he's not referring specifically to Christ or to someone who's lived up to God's perfect standard. He's speaking of people whose life pattern is to follow Christ. When we pray as Jesus would, we can trust that He intercedes before the Father on our behalf. Therefore, the sincere prayers of faithful followers of Christ are effective in bringing about God's purposes in our lives.
