

#### > EPHESIANS 5:8-21

For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light— 9 for the fruit of the light consists of all goodness, righteousness, and truth— <sup>10</sup> testing what is pleasing to the Lord. <sup>11</sup> Don't participate in the fruitless works of darkness, but instead expose them. 12 For it is shameful even to mention what is done by them in secret. 13 Everything exposed by the light is made visible, 14 for what makes everything visible is light. Therefore it is said: Get up, sleeper, and rise up from the dead, and Christ will shine on you.

**LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS**

In high school, I knew the first commandment of weight training—never lift free weights without a spotter! But I had a plan. When I didn't have a spotter, I always used a Smith Machine, a piece of equipment with the barbell attached to vertical rails and with pegs to rest the bar at various heights. However, on one particular day, I ran into a major problem. I had worked out so much that my arms were totally shot, and no matter how hard I tried, I couldn't lift the bar back up to the peg. So there I was with a heavy barbell pressing down on my chest, and I had to squirm out from under the weight in utter humility. There have been few moments in my life that were more embarrassing.

I foolishly thought I could do it on my own. Sometimes, we do the same thing in our Christian life. We think we can handle our challenges all on our own, but when we live this way, sooner rather than later, we're going to find ourselves in big trouble. Thankfully, God gave us the church to provide the help we need when life is heavy. As the Holy Spirit works in our lives, fellow Christians provide one another with the strength and encouragement we need to press forward when we feel beaten and weighed down by life's troubles.



#### LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS

Jesus sits at God's right hand and continually intercedes for believers as our advocate, mediator, and high priest.

Throughout His ministry, Jesus prayed over and over in order to remain relationally connected with the Father and to be strengthened by the Holy Spirit. Today, we all have our fair share of weaknesses, and we receive strength to pursue God's will from others in the church. Just as important, Christ continually intercedes for the people of God, so we would live out our faith.

All people have strengths and weaknesses, and we're much better off when we work together. Ultimately, however, we're powerless to accomplish the things God desires for His people on our own. Thankfully, Jesus.

### > CHRIST

Living in relationship with Jesus involves our being totally transformed—not just making a few changes. We are called to be like Jesus.

### >CULTURE


It's not enough for us to simply reject evil. We're to go one step further in exposing darkness, so others can see the truth.

### Day One **ROMANS 14:13**

The idea of a stumbling block is something people in church speak about fairly regularly, but many don't have a clear understanding of what this is. Here's what's happening in Romans 14. Jews who had come to Christ had trouble letting go of some of the ceremonial rites they'd practiced all their lives. Gentiles who had practiced pagan worship in the past struggled to see how their newfound faith applied to past activities. One specific issue was meat sacrificed to idols (1 Cor. 8:4). Paul taught that, because an idol is nothing, believers are free to eat this meat. However, for the former pagan, their consciences convicted them because they'd previously offered meat as sacrifices to pagan gods. Their conscience was misinformed, but they were convicted nonetheless. Paul taught that to eat meat in their presence or to encourage them to eat in a way that tempts them to offend their conscience is to cause them to stumble. Instead of judging one another for our weaknesses, we should express love through a willingness to give up even the things we're free to enjoy.

### Day Two **ROMANS 14:14-15**



In the Old Testament law, God declared certain foods "unclean" as a way of demonstrating that the Israelites were set apart from other nations. But under the New Covenant, in demonstrating the unity that exists in Christ and by the Spirit, God did away with these dietary restrictions, and foods were no longer unclean in and of themselves. We demonstrate that we are set apart not by what we eat, but through loving as Jesus did. Still, if our conscience convicts us that any food or activity is sinful, we must follow our convictions—to do otherwise is to sin. Therefore, we should always seek to encourage others in following their convictions, even if it means making sacrifices ourselves. This is how we show love.

- Why did God call Israel to abstain from certain foods? Today, how do we show that we're set apart?

### Day Three **ROMANS 14:16-17**

At times, people will criticize us for enjoying our freedoms in Christ. At other times, people will criticize us when we give up freedoms in order to serve a less mature believer. Either way, the truth is that we can't please everybody. Many have tried, but it's just not possible. With this in view, what matters most is that we seek to follow Christ in all we do and continually seek to show godly love to the people in our lives. Sometimes, this will mean giving up freedoms. Other times, it may involve our helping a less mature brother or sister to grow in understanding how the Bible speaks to their convictions. Whatever the case, our greatest concerns shouldn't be what we eat or drink, but how we can follow the Spirit's leading, continually working to see kingdom realities manifest among God's people.

### Day Four **ROMANS 14:18**

People continually observe the ways Christians live. The Pharisees were always following Jesus, scrutinizing His every move and looking for an opportunity to accuse Him. People will often view us this way, looking to discredit our faith. Others will observe, looking to find out if our faith is real or not. Either way, we need to be careful to live in a way that continually points others to Christ. One of the best ways to do this is to be patient, gracious, and sensitive to others. When we show love the ways Christ did, not only do we receive approval from God, but others who look at our lives will find out that our faith is real and that God truly does change those who trust Him.

Why do others continually look at the lives of Christians?

### Day Five **ROMANS 14:19**



Our world is characterized by conflict. We see it on the news and in our schools. We experience it in our families, and sometimes, conflict even exists in our churches. But this should never be the case. This isn't to say that Christians always need to have the same opinions or that we'll always get along perfectly. That will never happen. However, there are ways to disagree and still get along beautifully. God has called each of us to pursue peace and unity, and this happens only when we're willing to give up our own preferences in order to love and serve others. We live in an age where following Christ is not easy. One of the best ways to strengthen our brothers and sisters is to provide an environment of security and comfort in the church. Out there, it's a spiritual war! Let's make sure our churches provide the peace and safety God desires for His people.
