

## UNBIBLICAL STATEMENTS DAMAGE THE GOSPEL OF JESUS CHRIST

### The alternative for the unbiblical statement "God turned His back on Jesus."

The Father laid on Jesus more than His physical body could bear. By His knowledge, Jesus bore all our iniquities experiencing the physical, emotional, and mental anguish of all sin being against God. Isaiah 53:11 Jesus experienced the onslaught of all sin upon His physical body for three hours of darkness. Jesus felt this wrath of sin upon His physical body and was totally dependent upon the watchful eye of the Father to fulfill all of Scripture and bring about the complete and final condemnation of sin. Jesus was faithful and obedient unto death.

### The alternative for the unbiblical statement "God poured out His wrath on Jesus and punished Him for our sins."

On the Cross from noon until three o'clock, Jesus was given, by the Father, omniscience of all humanities sins. At the Cross, God condemned sin to the utmost through the sinless death of Jesus. Matthew 21:33-46 Romans 8:3

God gave His Son and Jesus gave His life to take away the sin of the world.

Jesus remained obedient even to physical death, always trusting in the Father to fulfill all Scripture and bring about the complete and final condemnation of sin. Because Jesus, the perfect man, died sinless under the very wrath of sin against Him, the Father has given resurrected Jesus the authority to remove all sin from Creation (Colossians 1:20; John 5:22,27; Matthew 28:18).

Jesus has the right as last Adam to remove sin from all who believe in Him and receive Him as LORD and Savior. Sin removal is a process including sanctification and glorification. Sin has eternal consequences for believers and holy living requires Holy Spirit guidance and power. Born again believers are new creations who have died with Christ to the old way of life and have been raised to newness of life in Christ. 1 Corinthians 3:11-15 2 Corinthians 5:17 Colossians 3:1-25

The alternative for the unbiblical statement "sin was imputed to Jesus." The death of sinless Jesus condemned sin to the utmost and gave Jesus authority to remove sin from all who believe in Him and remove sin from all of creation.

The alternative for the unbiblical statement "Jesus became sin." Jesus became the sin offering.
