

SUBSTITUTION

Sin killed Jesus. God the Father allowed all sin to be thrust upon His physical body because all sin is against God and Jesus is God. Matthew 21:33-40 Isaiah 53

Jesus died sinless. He never sinned. The purpose of His death was to condemn sin to the utmost.

Sin killed the innocent, sinless Son of God. Sin has proven itself worthy to be removed. Jesus arose with power and authority to remove all sin from creation. Romans 8:3,4, 9-11, 22-27, 37-39

Jesus is humanity's God-given substitute for Adam. Whereas Adam sinned and failed humanity, Jesus succeeded by not sinning and is on course to liberate all creation from sin, death, and Satan. The plan for deliverance from sin is outlined in the New Testament. Romans 5

Substitutionary Sacrifice of Christ condemns sin.

The finished work of Christ on the Cross sentences sin to removal.

The sinless death of Christ makes salvation possible for all.

The resurrected Christ imparts eternal life to those who believe and receive the gift through repentance and faith.

Election of God occurs after regeneration in Christ and is to holiness and service. Eph. 1:4

Predestination is the purpose of God to complete salvation to all those who are of readiness of mind to receive the gift of eternal life in Christ.
