

## FALSE IDEAS ASSOCIATED WITH KEY VERSES OF SCRIPTURE

**Jesus became sin. 2 Cor. 5:21 No. Not sin, but the sacrifice so that sin could be condemned.**

Sin was allowed to kill the physical body of Jesus in order to condemn sin to the utmost.

Jesus “bore our sin” means that sin came against Him and killed Him. 1 Peter 2:24 Jesus condemned sin in the flesh by allowing His flesh to be assaulted and killed by sin. Rom. 8:3 Jesus chose to become and He became the “sin offering.”

**The wrath of God fell upon Jesus at the cross. No. Psalm 22:1,24**

It felt to Jesus like God abandoned Him, but Jesus believed that God was in control. God the Father is always well pleased with the Son. God was allowing sin to condemn itself. Jesus defeated sin, death, and Satan. The Father watched meticulously over the Son and did not let even one bone to be broken. John 19:36 All sin struck out against Jesus. Sin killed Jesus and Jesus willingly died to become our last Adam with power to remove all sin. The Father allowed the Son to be bruised and die so that sin could be condemned and overcome. Immediately after Jesus quoted Psalm 22:1, He said “Father, into Your hands I commit My Spirit.” Both statements were made at about 3 P.M. Luke 23:44-46

**Jesus died to appease the wrath of an angry God. No. His death was the mercy seat.**

Romans 3:25 Jesus Christ produced the “action of mercy” for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. 1 John 2:2 Jesus died to take away the sin of the world. John 1:29

**Sin was imputed to Jesus at the cross. No, His sinless death condemned sin. Romans 8:3**

For our sake, God made Him to be the sin offering who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God. 2 Corinthians 5:21

**God sees the believer cloaked in the righteousness of Christ. No, God does righteous acts in the cooperating believer and our faith in His promises is counted for righteousness.**
