

RESTORATION OF ALL CREATION

Restoration of all creation to a state of no death and no sin is central to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The key to restoration of all creation was the sinless death of the physical body of Jesus. The precious blood of Jesus was killed by sin. The accumulated sin of all mankind was laid upon Jesus at the Cross. "And the Lord laid on Him the iniquity of us all." Isaiah 53:6b
The most atrocious and most condemning thing that sin could do is to kill the physical body of Jesus Christ, the Eternal Son of God.
